

Investment Objective

To invest in the global healthcare sector with the objective of achieving a high level of capital growth. In order to achieve its investment objective, the Company invests worldwide in a diversified portfolio of shares in pharmaceutical and biotechnology companies and related securities in the healthcare sector. It uses gearing, and derivative transactions to enhance returns and mitigate risk. Performance is measured against the MSCI World Health Care Index (net total return, sterling adjusted).

Commentary

In February, the NAV per share fell 0.5%, the share price was unchanged, and the MSCI World Health Care Index was down 4.4%.

For the second month so far in 2021, macro factors - not fundamentals - drove share price moves in the equity markets. Major indexes made new all-time highs in February yet faded at month's end due to rising bond yields. Interest rates and reflation commentary created a headwind particularly for healthcare stocks in the month. Moreover, the sector appeared to be a source of funds as investors rotated into other sectors and industries with perceived better rates and growth proxies. As a result, each subsector component of our Benchmark, the MSCI World Health Care Index, posted negative returns in the period for a cumulative selloff of 4.4%.

Nevertheless, meaningful outperformance was generated in February through a combination of stock picking and sector allocation. All subsectors, save for one, contributed to the relative outperformance. The only subsector which did not contribute was emerging biotechnology, which was purely a function of allocation effect given the prominent overweight positioning (>20% versus the Benchmark). Otherwise, the subsectors with the largest contributors to outperformance were large cap pharmaceuticals (allocation), specialty pharmaceuticals (stock picking), life science tools (mix of both), and medical devices (stock picking). The largest single stock contributor was the specialty pharmaceutical company, Horizon Therapeutics. The company's share price benefitted from several factors in February including a well-received acquisition, a competitor pipeline setback, solid 4Q20 results, and 2021 guidance that exceeded investors' expectations. Another top contributor was Boston Scientific. The share price rallied in February after the company provided 2021 financial guidance against a positive backdrop of a recovery for medical device procedures. Finally, shares in the diagnostics company, Natera had a strong February as fourth quarter results contained strong guidance for 2021, a new product launch for comprehensive genomic profiling called Altera, and encouraging commentary around recent product launches in liquid biopsy and kidney transplant rejection. Looking ahead, we hope for a return of investor interest on industry fundamentals as healthcare valuations continue to compress and look very compelling to us. News flow that is perhaps more healthcare centric should bolster stocks, but we do acknowledge market volatility from moving interest rates, the COVID pandemic, and still early days for the Biden administration may cloud the robust innovation story that continues to define healthcare companies in our

He studied business administration at Bayreuth University in Germany and received a M.Sc. (Econs.), Accounting and Finance, from The London School of Economics; he is a citizen of both Germany and Sweden.

Portfolio Manager Profile

OrbiMed Capital LLC (OrbiMed) is owned by six principals, including Sven Borho who have between them many years' experience of investing in the pharmaceutical, biotechnology and healthcare sectors. The U.S. based company has over 80 investment professionals who carry out extensive research, involving company visits and evaluating the commercial and scientific prospects for individual drugs. OrbiMed is registered as an investment adviser under the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). SEC registration does not imply a certain level of skill or training.

Investment Policy

The Company offers a superior UK-listed opportunity for capital appreciation through a diversified portfolio of worldwide pharmaceutical, biotechnology, healthcare equipment, healthcare services companies. The Portfolio Manager seeks to reduce risk through extensive fundamental research, worldwide exposure, position limits, and balanced market capitalisations. The Company's investment policy allows gearing, through borrowing, of up to 20% of net assets and a net exposure to derivative investments (excluding swaps) of up to 5% of the portfolio. Equity swaps may also be used, counterparty exposure here is limited to 12% of the portfolio at the time of acquisition. Unquoted securities will not exceed 10% of the portfolio at the time of acquisition.

Discount / Premium Control Mechanism

The Directors have adopted an active discount management policy to establish and support an improved rating in the Company's shares through the use of share buybacks, with a view to limiting the discount to the ex income NAV per share at which the shares trade to no more than 6%. Shares bought back may be held in treasury for reissue at later dates at not more than the discount at which they were purchased, and in any event at a discount no greater than 5% to the prevailing cum income net asset value per share. Any shares left in treasury are cancelled around the time of the AGM. In order to stop the share price trading at a significant premium to the NAV per share, the Company has the ability to issue new shares at a 0.7% premium to the cum income NAV per share.
